

Classroom Expectations

In fifth grade, one of my primary goals is to prepare students for the ever changing and ever growing future. I have high expectations for all of my students and I will work diligently to hold all students accountable.

Come to school on time (class will begin at 7:50. If you are not present before the door closes, you will be marked absent/tardy).

Come to school prepared. You should have: all assignments completed, necessary school supplies, and a positive attitude.

Wear appropriate attire to school- Uniforms are required daily.

- Girls' shorts/skirts may NOT be higher than their middle fingers when arms are at their sides.
- Bottoms may not be "baggy" or sag below hips.

Keep your work organized using your planner & AVID Binder.

- Your planner will be used to document all of your homework, assignment due dates, and dates to remember.
- Your AVID binder will be used to file your homework, your class work, and your notes. It's very important that you have both planner and binder in school every day

Complete and turn in all assignments—classwork and homework—on time.

- Homework is your chance to practice what we learn in class and outside of class. Classwork allows Miss Stevens to view your progress and to help you gain more knowledge for the next grade level.

Put effort into all of your assignments (Write neatly, show your work when needed, incorporate details, and DOUBLE check your writing and/or your calculations).

Participate in class. Ms. Stevens enjoys hearing your thinking and your opinions.

Show "SLANT" at all times.

S	Sit Up	Both feet should be flat on the floor, your back straight, your head up and facing the speaker, and your hands on top of your desk. Sitting with proper posture helps you pay better attention to lessons, and interact more with discussions and activities.
L	Lean Forward	Leaning forward will show you are interested in the lesson and you are listening.

A	Ask Meaningful Questions	Stay on the topic and ask meaningful, interested questions about the discussion and activities. Your question might help others understand the lesson better too.
N	Nod Yes and No	Nodding your head shows the teacher you understand the lesson. It is a non-verbal conversation between you and the teacher.
T	Talk with Teacher	Communicate with the teacher both during and after class to make sure you understand, get extra help, check on your progress, or get missed assignments. If you are confused about something, ASK the teacher. Also attend tutorials ~ they are there to help you.
